

The Ways of Wings

Airplanes take different forms, based on where the wings are mounted in relation to the fuselage. These are the four most common...

Low wing: mounted near or below the bottom of the fuselage.



Mid wing: mounted approximately half way up the fuselage.



High wing: mounted on the upper fuselage.



<u>Parasol wing</u>: raised clear above the top of the fuselage, typically by struts or pedestals.
